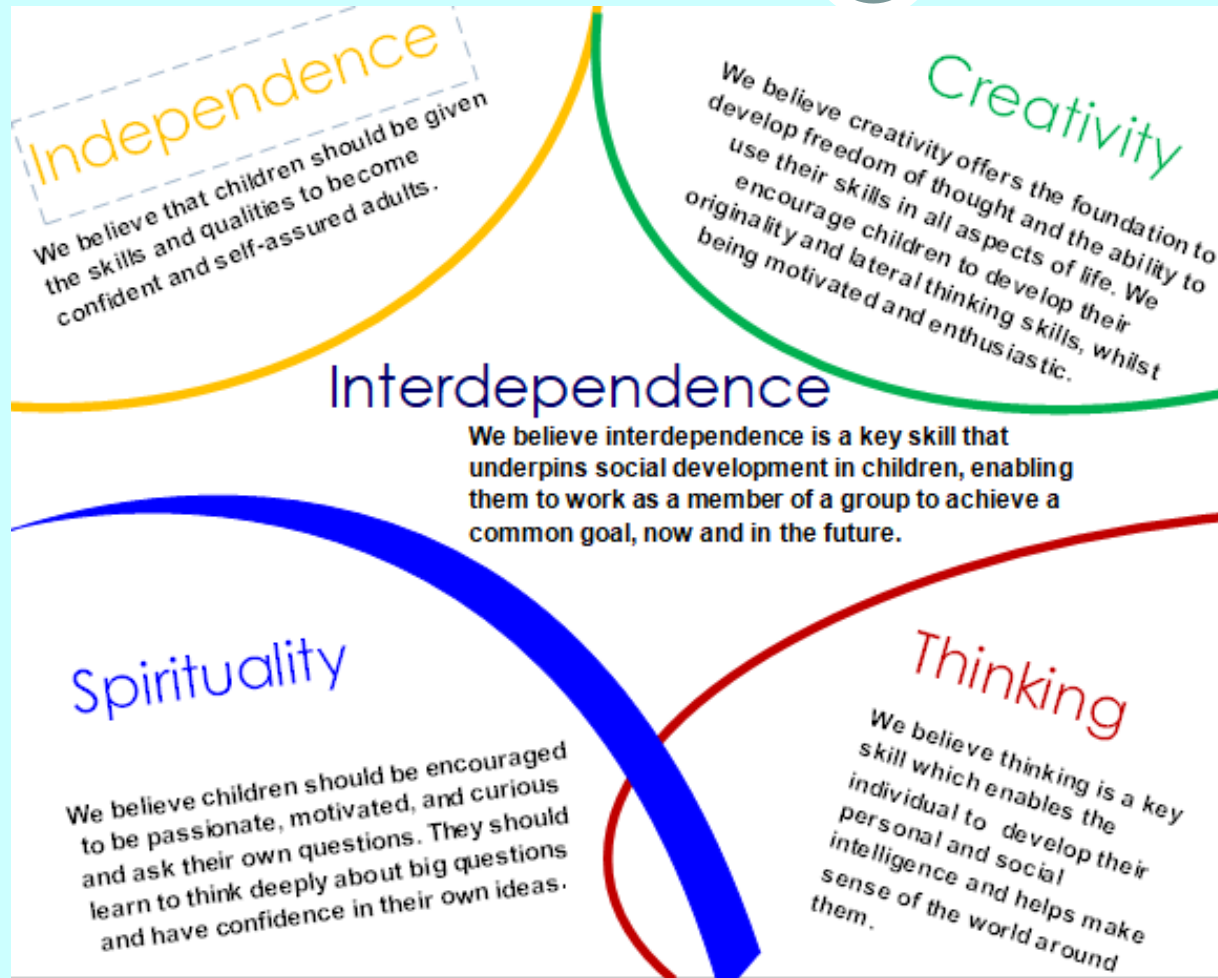
# CIRCLE Values



- **The CIRCLE Values** underpin and embed all we do at St Mark's. They permeate throughout the school, creating a harmonious, enabling and empowering school community.



# Learning Values



- **The LEARNING Values** drive our curriculum. They are developed progressively over the seven years of primary education and ensure our children are successful learners.



# Expectations



## **Behaviour:**

High standards of behaviour are expected from children at all times. We use the CIRCLE Values to underpin this.

## **Attendance:**

If your child is feeling ill please try to bring them in if it's minor as it is important they miss as little amount of school as possible - mostly they bounce back. If children don't bounce back, we know where you are to arrange collection of them.

## **Uniform:**

Children are expected to wear correct school uniform at all times. High standards of dress are required, reinforcing the standards of appearance and behaviour that are needed to meet and maintain high expectations.

# School Jobs – Job Junction



- Year 5/6 children can apply for a range of school jobs as part of our “Job Junction” – these may include reading buddies, register monitors etc.
- Soon the children will be told about these positions, and invited to complete an application form. Teachers will then make selections.
- Children usually have the job for one term – to enable as many children as possible to have a turn.



# Homework



Our aims when setting homework are to:

- Reinforce and practise skills taught and developed at school.
- Enable parents to gain insight into their child's learning and to be able to support it.
- Prepare children for secondary education when children are expected to undertake regular daily homework programmes.
- Encourage children to develop a love of reading and establish the routine of reading for pleasure in their spare time.
- Completing homework is essential to success and it is essential that it is always completed - no excuses!



# Homework



- Weekly homework is set for all Year 5/6 children.
- It will include spellings, English and Maths.
- It will take approximately 20-30 minutes to complete.
- It is set on a **Tuesday and due in on a Monday.**

Spellings: Are taught in class and the games and tests on spelling shed support the spelling rules we are learning.

Reading: A comprehension is sent home each week and children are expected to read at home a minimum of 5 times per week

Maths: Your child will be set a piece of maths homework on My Maths. This will be related to work being covered in class and at a suitable level for your child.

# Homework - Reading



Reading: In Year 5/6 we expect children to read 5 times a week, to an adult at home.

Your child has a reading record – please ensure you write a comment every time you hear your child read. This is helpful to us, to know successes and issues which we can support in class.

**Reading Records and reading books must be in school everyday** – so we can hear them read too!

Reading books will be changed once a week.

# Homework – Times Tables

Times Table: In Year 5/6 it is crucial the children know their times tables in order to access and make progress in maths.

Practising little and often is best – daily for 5 to 10 minutes!

There are many excellent APPS on line to practise times tables. Top Marks “hit the Button” is fab!

We provide all children with a “Times Table Rock Stars” Login, through our school subscription.



# Supporting Your Child With Their Weekly Homework.



- Be **positive** about homework.
- The best time for children to do their homework is **soon after they arrive home, after having a snack and drink**. Please set a routine at home to ensure it is completed.
- Provide a reasonably **quiet** and **suitable** place where your child can work.
- Make sure that they have **appropriate equipment**.
- Provide **guidance**, not answers.
- Encourage them to take responsibility for completion.
- Spellings and times tables - daily practice is best – little and often.
